
Textile, Apparel, Electronics & Healthcare.







Livelihood Mapping of Local Artisans

Given the above brief description of the area and the people, with its vast experience team in rural marketing, working with the poor, appropriate technology innovations, particularly in livelihood & Enterprise Development with rural community especially women of underprivileged family, decided to make attempts to develop appropriate systems for Value Addition of the local Value chain of suitable enterprise opportunities and possible market linkages for providing higher returns to the deserving families of the area.

The community prevalent here in this part of Changlang is largely depended on animal husbandary (Directly or as farm laborer). A quick assessment was done on the livelihood Pattern of the Locations of Miao changlang, Kharsang, Namphai, Jairampur circle, Kuttom of Changlang District. In order to develop a concept note and formulate a project proposal on Livelihood Enterprise Development program on modern Handloom practices. After several rounds of discussions with the local Artisans, Local community leaders, local Opinion leaders, local technology support institutions. A mapping was attempted to explore and develop a management system for linking Local communities to markets through Value Addition in the Value chain of Handloom Products market of this area.

Investigative Team of Livelihood Mapping

- The team that was involved in the data assimilation consisted of professionals from Bethel Life Care Cahritable Trust.
- All members were also involved in this report and focused group interviews with the individual Artisans families, in order to collect data.

METHODOLOGY

A) PRIMARY SOURCES

- Focus Group Discussions (FGDs): FGDs were useful in terms of extracting qualitative information and cross-checking the same to have concrete understanding of the situation. Although it consumed formidable time, the outcome was very good. Moderating and leading discussion as per the objective was found to be important. It was necessary to keep the discussions focused and cautiously make the participants give the information sought. Each locality had at least one FGD.
- Observations: The information collectors were careful and were verifying facts through our own observations as well. It was found to be another successful methodology, which enabled us to compare the responses of the people with physical observations in the area.
- Key Informant Interviews: Important opinions were collected from local offices of Handloom department.



JAIRAMPUR (A.P.)

Description of Changlang District.

Changlang district occupies an area of 4,662 square kilometres (1,800 sq mi), comparatively equivalent to Indonesia's Lombok Island. It falls in a region that receives high rainfall. The region is rich in wildlife with a different kind of flora and fauna. The district has both plains and highlands. Most of the plains are in the valley of Dihing. The area is prone to occasional floods.

Inequitable livelihood opportunities result in the deprivation and destitution of people. Deprivation or inequality implies the state of not having the resources, opportunities and benefits that other people in the society have. On the other, destitution or poverty can be defined as the inability of a section of the society to execute even its basic necessities of life. pattern of rural livelihood in Changlang district with specific focuses on the following dimensions of livelihood issues: agriculture, industry, non-farm activities, the extent of poverty – income poverty, human poverty, etc.



Key findings

Human Capital

Traditional Skills of the People: The method of Handloom in these areas is highly labour intensive. Male and Sometimes female from an Artisans family participate in the Handloom activity. So with the reduction of family size in recent times has increase in deploying farm labourers from surrounding areas.

There are times when women too are buying and selling the inputs and final output. Young girls have the additional responsibilities of caring for their young siblings and do the household chores like cooking and washing, while their parents are away in the fields.

Migration

It was observed that very often Local Artisans generally practising with manual basis and household of such group in lease in the age group 35-45 years migrated to places outside district & sometimes even outside Arunachal Pradesh. The main reason for migration is the lack of sustainable income source and the failure of existing livelihood system to support their food security and cash requirements. Consistent employment throughout the year is also not assured

due to non availability of alternative or additional source of income.

Social Capital

During our discussion sessions, we came to know about existence of SHG in our areas. Yet, the families have hardly any faith to get benefit out of them. Most of the SHGs are formed by District Administration, NABARD etc but, due to lack of mentoring after formation they lost their vision and become inactive.

Opinion Leaders of the Villages

The major contribution in the village decision-making is of the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI) members, Local community leader they are the ward members and have a final say in the village meetings. These meetings are held within the village, once or twice in a month. The frequency could be more depending upon the urgency of a situation. The advice of the village school teachers, village heads or even the village post master is sought for important decisions.

Physical Capital

The key observations during this study in terms of Physical Capital are as follows:

- No to Small land holding among population,
- Most of them work through lease rent from land holders,
- Lack of small scale entrepreneurship,
- Poor bank linkage for Weaving activities,
- Lack of updated knowledge, skill and motivation for Handloom activity,
- Lack of organized market and well defined supply chain

conclusion: It is prevalent that, even after a long years and adaptation of reform policies by our State Government, the reality hasn't changed much. While discussing this, we found a need of generating Awareness about the available supports from state government. So, to our opinion, we should put our effort to establish a Common Facility Centre (CFC) where in every information wil be available with regular follow up with families and coordinating their issues with the local authorized representative.

JAIRAMPUR (A.P.)

Report on Biodiversity Risk & Livelihood Practices



State of Arunachal Pradesh is rich in both cultural and biodiversity. Forest is rich in endemic plants and animal species of economics, ecological and cultural significance to the region. The traditional knowledge heritage and ancient wisdom systems of 26 major tribes and 110 subtribes are contributing towards effective conservation and sustainable utilization of biodiversity. Tribal communities of Arunachal Pradesh consider Forest Ecosystem and Biodiversity as inseparable and holistic entity. The Traditional Knowledge of tribal communities understands that the coordinated function of Forest Ecosystem and Biodiversity is essential to maintain uninterrupted flow of ecosystem Goods and Services.

Jairampur

In an Arunachal Pradesh forest there is tremendous diversity to be used all the year round and thus when diversity reduces; the local communities of Arunachal Pradesh have fewer resources to bank on and are rendered vulnerable. This is particularly evident for agro-biodiversity. The prevalence of high yielding varieties has suppressed and sidelined the cultivation of local varieties of crops. It is also argued that forests regulate poverty and acute poverty exhausts biodiversity. The pressure on biodiversity cannot be wished away, and it is exerted from several sides, not all of which can be accounted. The best way out would be to diversify livelihoods so as to take the pressure off biodiversity. Many schemes of Arunachal Pradesh oriented towards livelihood generation have encouraged livelihoods on particular species but have an insufficient component for conservation of biodiversity. Local biodiversity is also overlooked in many schemes for plantations - for example under the rehabilitation plans the secondary forests continue to be cleared for plantation of commercial species like Tectona grandis and Gmelina arborea. Further, the neglect of crop and livestock biodiversity list for evident we have mention below there is already some spesies of fish like Bok Pithia and Jonga Pithia are in Endangered Species and Several cropes, Livestock are in Vulnarable condition. For this Matter we have discussed with Mr. Taba Teni, Forest Range Officer, Jairampur, Changalng. For further work of biodevirsity with mutual discussion with Mr. Taba Teni, Forest Range Officer and planned about next course of action (ARE)

- Maintain health, safety and security at work place




Solar Panel Installation Technician

This is a skill oriented course in the study of solar photovoltaic (PV) cells, modules, and system components; electrical circuits; PV system design and sizing for use in homes, commercial building etc and manage livelihood out of it. The course involves 440 hours of classroom training followed by on-job training. In this year we have enrolled and trained 120 Beneficiaries in this project. 30 candidates per batch were participated in this course and 85 % out of 120 candidates passed out. After completion of course 71% of them had get their Placement in regarding sector.














General Duty Assistant









Self Employed Tailor






Access Computer & Digital Literacy Mission















Women Skill Development Centre (WSDC) (Jairampur)



Awarenes Camp On Good Agricultural Practices




